Wye Marsh has a new resident—Ernie the Broad-Winged Hawk!

Ernie is a male Broad-Winged Hawk who comes to us after being found in Victoria Harbour and rehabilitated with the Owl Foundation. Ernie cannot be released to the wild because he has a fused right shoulder which prevents him from flying. Ernie will be well cared for and admired at Wye Marsh by staff and volunteers.

Broad-winged Hawks are small, compact raptors with chunky bodies and large heads. They have a wing span between 81-100 cm. Broad-Winged Hawks are very common to the Simcoe County area, keep your

eyes open for them around the edges of forests in particular!
