Walking between Sainte-Marie and the Wye Marsh? See if you can spot these 6 Canadian icons in the forest!

- 1. Samuel de Champlain admired this First Nation vessel for its speed and elegance.
- 2. Dappled with white dots, mimicking sunlight shining through leaves, these beautiful "fawns" are born each spring, about 6 -12 weeks after Sweetwater!
- 3. Native to this land at the time of Sainte-Marie, this feathered giant was later hunted out by early settlers. Friends of Wye Marsh helped reintroduce it to Ontario after a 200-year absence.
- 4. Inspired by a hare's foot, this First Nation innovation can help us walk on snow.

- 5. What takes 10 years to grow from seed to flower, has three white petals, and has been used by the saints to teach spirituality?
- 6. This fascinating reptile can "walk" under water, and is central to the Wendat story of creation.
