



A message from the Executive Director

After a wonderful and busy summer, we are looking forward to Fall, and a couple of very exciting upcoming projects and changes!

The first project is one for which we have been raising funds for 18 months – the revitalization of the Bird Barn housing our bigger Birds of Prey including Scarlet the Red-tailed Hawk, Darwin the Turkey Vulture, Ziibi the Bald Eagle, and Becker the Great Horned Owl. We are VERY close to reaching our financial goal, and are moving forward with the engineered plans, environmental assessments and federal permits required with a hopeful start date of mid-October, and conclusion by the end of 2024. This project will be overseen by Facilities Manager Paul Beauchamp. If you would like to be part of this monumental project, please speak with me or Animal Care Coordinator Johanna Rumney to learn more about how you can help. At the time of writing, we are only \$40K away from our total goal of over a ¼ million dollars. We would love your assistance in getting us across the finish line!

The second project will focus on our trails – more specifically making some of our trails more physically accessible for visitors thanks to funding from Environment and Climate Change Canada; and making it easier for visitors to find their way on the trails thanks to funding for new directional signage from Tourism Simcoe County. This project will be overseen by Stewardship & Conservation Manager Craig Pezik, working closely with Canada Wildlife Services. This will limit trail access to the Hardwood and Return trails for much of October and November, but access will continue to be available to visitors via the Service Road. Won't it be nice to finally see some new directional signage on the Wye Marsh trails?

We also want to take this opportunity to introduce you to our new Education Coordinator, Chris Burns! He will be taking the role formerly held by Jennifer Pelletier, who left our organization in July. Chris joins us with years of experience working as an interpreter at Sainte Marie, a teacher for the Simcoe County District School Board, and as a volunteer with several local organizations. Please join us in welcoming Chris when you get a chance to meet him in the coming month.

We look forward to seeing you at Wye Marsh this Autumn!

The marsh is once again excited to hold our Online Silent Auction, November 15-24th. Keep an eye out for all of the marvellous items you can bid on!



And my huge thank you to the staff and volunteers of the Wye Marsh. You all do a fantastic job! Rick Brady, President, Friends of Wye Marsh





Friends of Wye Marsh are proud to once again be selling Bob Whittam's book, "The Birds of Georgian Bay!"

MEET KENNY The American Kestrel

REASON FOR LIVING AT WYE MARSH:

Human Imprint- Illegal Falconry Use

AGE: 3

American Kestrels are North America's most common and widespread falcon. They are about the size of a Mourning Dove and are often seen on power lines in farmlands. Unfortunately, their population declined by an estimated 51% between 1966 and 2017. Recent studies point to a lack of food availability, possibly tied to widespread pesticide use, as one of several reasons for the continuing declines.




